This minor adjustment would reduce housing capacity by a mere **15%**, making little difference to real estate investors either way.

3. Bureaucracy and Delays:

Incorporation adds layers of bureaucracy, slowing responses to community needs. Remaining unincorporated allows us to maintain control over local decisions without unnecessary red tape.

4. Historical Context:

Attempts to incorporate in the early **1980s** failed due to the high costs of essential services like trash pickup and police. The financial burden remains unchanged and worse today with county taxes that are already extremely high.

5. Disregarding Democracy:

The group that is trying to incorporate only needs 1,200 signatures to proceed. This is less than 15% of Bethlehem's residents. This is such a small group of citizens making a huge decision.

6. Misleading Claims:

Some may falsely claim incorporation is necessary for community protection. We can manage growth without sacrificing our autonomy or facing higher taxes.
